In my absence at another commitment, thank you to our Secretary Teresa who acted as our photographer and gave the following report. Editor.

FEBRUARY 2023 NEW GROWERS MEETING (Cont'd)

New Growers Report

At the New Growers Meeting, I decided to show members how to repot an old Phalaenopsis. I have had this phallie for many years and have won at least two first prizes and one second at the Bribie Shows in the harlequin section (see photo from 2015 show). This plant was now ungainly and needed repotting. As I tell members, the best time to repot an orchid is after it has bloomed. This plant was at this stage and sending out a nice lot of new roots at the top section. I cut the main stem just below the new root growths and applied steriprune to both sides of the cut.

Using wet mix and having watered the plant the day before, I continued to repot the top part into new mix. I have left the bottom section in the same pot hoping it will send out new growths. I will now not water the plant for a few days to allow the cut to fully heal.

I have never treated a phallie this way but have done so to a vanda in the past. Because I have cut it at the right time of the growth period it should be alright. I hope to be waving around a blue ribbon at our October show.

Thanks again to Jo Jackson for dropping off three trays of phallies from the Brisbane florist where she works. These plants are used in office buildings and discarded when new blooming plants replace the display. Some of the plants did not like moving from their airconditioned comfort to the heat wave conditions of last week. I showed members how to cut off the affected leaf and seal with steriprune. Ten large plants were used for the raffle and others given away to new members. I have another tray of plants that I will bring to the Cultural meeting.


