MARCH 2023 NEW GROWERS MEETING

The March New Growers Meeting for 2023 on Saturday 11th March saw 16 members and 3 visitors attend The Orchid House to see/hear Zelda demonstrate how to repot an orchid that had been grown in river stone. Zelda purchased this orchid Rlc. Spanish Eyes 'Tian Mu' Mc, one she had been particularly looking for, from Alice's Orchids at Townsville during our recent bus trip to the Queensland International Orchid Fair. Zelda explained that a lot of the northern Queensland growers use stone instead of bark which is not readily available, most of it coming from South Australia or New Zealand, and the northern weather being very conducive to growing in stone or volcanic rock (Scoria) i.e. the plants get very wet and then dry out.

With our Easter Show only 4 weeks away, Zelda took the opportunity to explain and demonstrate how to present our plants to display them to the best of their ability, including cleaning the leaves and the pot, putting it in a larger pot to stop it falling over if it is unbalanced, removing any weeds or damaged foliage, excess stakes or tie-wires etc.















MARCH 2023 CULTURAL MEETING

Thank you to Tony Musial (good to see you back on deck Tony), Martin Gunther and Trish Stevenson our Orchid and Foliage judges for the day. The orchid numbers were slightly up on last month's figures whilst foliage numbers were down. Perhaps a lot of members ae saving their best blooms and foliage for our Easter Show! Please bring your plants along to bench at the Show. It doesn't matter if they are not Show quality, they all add to the atmosphere, and there's nothing sadder than empty benches at an Orchid and Foliage Show.

The meeting was well attended and the group got to learn about Carnivorous plants for our member Ben Timmings who spends a lot of time wandering around the Island checking out the number of carnivorous plants growing locally. Ben's talk, while short, was very informative with members learning that these plants grow in vastly different climatic conditions eg from arid deserts to boggy lowlands. They're largely self-sufficient in a lot of ways. Having originated in boggy, swampy areas, they have adapted to their native low-nutrient soils in an innovative way - by trapping and digesting insects to gain all the nutrients they need, therefore no fertilisers necessary. Carnivorous plants are a bit like orchids and do not like to be over potted. A combination of peat moss and perlite makes the ideal growing medium. A number of members availed themselves of the interesting plants Ben had for sale. Thank you Ben.

After the raffle, which was well patronised with a number of prizes including Phalaenopsis plants and a couple of bottles of wine kindly donated by Sue Harrison, was run and won, President Diann reminded the group that there will be **NO New Growers Meeting for April** due to our Easter Show, and **NO April** Cultural meeting as that date falls on Anzac Day. The next New Growers Meeting will be Saturday 13th May and the Next Cultural Meeting will be Tuesday 23rd May.

After a quick tidy of the hall and a flurry of activity making sure everyone knew what times and days they needed to be on deck for setting up the 2 halls for the Show and what they had to bring etc members adjourned for Afternoon tea.



Dendrobium Species Dendrobium spectabile

Dendrobium spectabile is an orchid species identified by (Blume) Miq. in 1859.

ORIGIN: From Papua & New Guinea and the Solomon Islands at elevations of 300 to 2000 meters although it is most often from 300 to 500 meters.

DESCRIPTION: A spectacular, medium to large sized, hot growing epiphyte in primary rainforests, mangrove swamps and moss forests as well as an occasional lithophyte on rocks. Semiglobose at the base, to 8 noded stems carrying to 5, towards the apex, lanceolate to ovate, coriaceous, obtuse leaves, that blooms in the winter and early spring on an axillary, 8 to 16 [20 to 40 cm] long, few to many flowered [to 20] raceme with minute, oblong bracts that arises from near the apex of leafed mature canes.

FLOWER SIZE: To 3 inches [to 7.5 cm] -- information provided by Jay Pfahl, author of the Internet Orchid Species Encyclopedia (IOSPE).

Dendrobium is a genus of mostly epiphytic and lithophytic orchids in the family Orchidaceae. It is a very large genus, containing more than 1,800 species that are found in diverse habitats throughout much of south, east and southeast Asia, including China, Japan, India, the Philippines, Indonesia, Australia, New Guinea, Vietnam and many of the islands of the Pacific. Orchids in this genus have roots that creep over the surface of trees or rocks, rarely having their roots in soil. Up to six leaves develop in a tuft at the tip of a shoot and from one to a large number of flowers are arranged along an unbranched flowering stem. Several attempts have been made to separate *Dendrobium* into smaller genera, but most have not been accepted by the World Checklist of Selected Plant Families. Excerpt from Wikipedia.
