What used to be classed as Cattleya—Novelty or Compact is now classed as Exhibition 75—110mm.

Cattleyas under 75mm are no longer classed as Exhibition therefore they are now benched under Cattleya Non Exhibition.

A ROADMAP FOR NEW GROWERS

You've joined the Bribie Island Orchid Society and **have an orchid in flower**. What should you do?



Firstly, remember that you must have owned your plants for at least 6 months before you are able to bench them for judging. If you have recently acquired a plant and it is flowering, you may bench it with a sign 'Not to be judged - Display only'. Please bring your flowering plants along to the New Growers Meeting held on the second Saturday of the month, and the Cultural Meeting on the fourth Tuesday of the month. If you have a mishap on the way and damage/lose a flower, just pop it in the pot—it can still be judged.

You will then need to complete a blue slip with the name of your plant on the front (if you don't know the name, just put 'Unknown') and add your name and Pot/Member number on the back. The blue slip should be displayed on a wire in your pot with the name of the plant showing. Please ask another member where you can find the tags and wires

At Cultural Meetings only—enter The Orchid House and sign the attendance book at the front counter. When signed in proceed with your plant to the rear of the hall on the left hand side and from the pegboard select the tag with your 'Pot/Member Number' and drop it in the cake tin on the table where the President, Secretary and Treasurer sit for the meeting. During the meeting one of those tags will be drawn from the tin and the owner of that tag will receive a \$5 voucher to spend with Paul Firth at our Cultural Supplies corner.

Then proceed to the tables on the right hand side of the hall where you will find signs designating the various genera eg Novice Cattleya, Novice Dendrobium, etc and deposit your plant. If you don't know which section fits, any of our friendly members will be happy to help.

B I O S run 2 competitions each year for New Growers, apart from our two shows at Easter and then in Spring. The first competition is run at the New Growers Meetings and Cultural Meetings where points are allocated – 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd and 1 for 3rd. The Judge's Choice at this meeting not only wins points but also 'The Finger' (a small wooden trophy shaped like Bribie Island), which the grower gets to hold for the next month, and a plant. These points are accumulated from 1st May to 30th April each year with the winner/s announced at our AGM/Cultural Meeting at the end of June. The Novice with the most points in a year will be Novice Champion and will win a Trophy and a cash amount.

The other competition is run for New Growers who bench their plants at the monthly Cultural Meetings. In addition to points and 'The Finger', the Judges Choice plant is also photographed and these photos are judged at the end of the year and the winning grower/s presented with the Merv Anderson Award for the best New Grower plant.

There will be a new special award for the most successful New Grower (restricted to Bribie Island Orchid Society Members only} at our Spring Show in October 2023.

This Award will be sponsored by Rob & Linda Trost from RoLin Orchids and will be a \$100 voucher to purchase plants from their nursery at Elimbah with Rob indicating this voucher should buy you around 8 nice plants.

NB Foliage plants are judged at monthly Cultural Meetings only, and there is no separate section for New Growers. Foliage plants are benched on the tables to the right as you enter The Orchid House, with categories of Bromeliads, Tillandsias, Anthuriums, Ferns, Other Foliage and Foliage with Flowers.

During the Cultural meeting, the President will call for members to select their choice of their favourite orchid and foliage plant, and record those plant numbers on slips of paper which are then deposited into the appropriate containers at the management table. The votes are then counted and \$5 Cultural Corner vouchers are presented to the growers of **the 'People's Choice' Orchid and Foliage plant.** New Growers plants are known to have been winners of these categories in the past.

New Growers, don't be shy! Bring your plants along to be benched. We'd love to see what you are growing!





Why orchids do not bloom

Weather – sudden rise or fall in temperature will cause buds to die especially when they are about 10mm. too much rain will rot/damage buds.

Potting – repotting when new leads are past the half way growth stage will often result in no blooms on that lead.

Position – not enough light. Orchidhouse should be 50-70% shadecloth with plenty of air movement.

Pests – mealy bugs, dendrobium beetles, snails etc damage buds causing them to die. Other pests are yourself...breaking off buds when staking leads/buds.

Sheaths – sheaths open at the top will fill up with water and buds will rot. Use thumbnail to insert small slot at base of sheath to release water. Paper sheaths should be left alone as some will contain buds. They can take up to 12 mths to develop. Cattleyas without sheaths can fill with water and buds will drown.

Fertiliser – too much will result in too much growth and no blooms. Use Searles 'bloomer' or 'booster' depending on growth period.

Watering – too much will rot roots and new leads resulting in a plant that is too stressed to produce blooms. Some genera require a dry period in winter to allow buds to develop e.g. dendrobiums.

I am often asked this question and have put together a list of factors that result in bud loss. As you can see everything we do can result in bud loss. You need all these things to come together to get beautiful blooms. It also proves that 'too much' of anything is not good for plants either.
