JULY 2023 NEW GROWERS MEETING

July's New Growers Meeting had Zelda introducing our newcomers to the mysteries of orchid naming and labelling. While rather a dry subject, and a bit confusing, the 32 members and guests present took it on board to absorb the principals and we look forward to seeing their efforts on labelling at future meetings. Zelda used OrchidWiz to demonstrate the history of orchids being hybridized and it was interesting to see the family tree of plants not only in names but also in the photos of the lineage. The history of the Sanders family and the massive job they have done over many years recording the parentage and registration of orchids was a real eye-opener for the audience.

The application of clonal names was explained as well as the abbreviations for some genre and the various awards which, while not necessary on benching tags, is a sign of quality plants, and also whether they are mericlones (ie they should be replicas of the original cross). Our newcomer Allan was berated (all in good fun) for discarding tags on his orchids, not realizing their importance. We all have to learn and Allan will no doubt have a correctly written tag when he benches his plants at future meetings. Plant tags are not only for displaying the correct name of your orchid but historical information eg when the plant was purchased, when it was potted, when it flowered and how many flowers or sprays were produced, can be recorded on the back of the tag as a quick reference point down the track. Lost tags = Unknowns and most collections include a few of those. Congratulations to Ros Ramsey who benched her lovely Epi. Wedding Valley 'Sakura' to take out 'The Finger' and another 1st with Spa. Mellow Yellow, whilst newcomer Heather Turnbull hit the points table with her 2nd for Zyg. Unknown. Well done ladies!



Twinkle, from Brian Heath who was our guest speaker for the day, and they were not disappointed. Brian gave a very informative talk on *Laelia anceps* and their growing conditions. We learned that Laelias which originated in Mexico and Brazil, grow on the eastern side of mountain ranges, and on the eastern side of trees and rocks, in 1^0-40^0 C temperatures and are called 'The Beginners Orchid' as they are supposedly hard to kill! They are temperature and drought resistant and bloom from late Autumn to early Winter with flowers appearing well above the foliage. In addition, they are fairly quick growers. Brian's powerpoint presentation of the numerous cultivars of Laelias brought a lot of oohs and aahs from members with the large variety of colours and shapes so it will be interesting to see if this talk generates any interest in members growing these beauties down the track.

Our guest speaker was also put to work judging the Oncidiums benched, with Zelda's lovely white *Onc.* Twinkle taking out 1st. 'Twinkles' are very rewarding plants to grow, especially with the range of colours available these days. Tony Musial was our judge for the remainder of the Orchid classes, apart from the Classes where he had entries, with Zelda stepping in, and our visitor Dawn Farrell from the Bribie Island Garden Club judged the Foliage classes in Trish's absence. Thank you judges.

Nice to see our new member Alan Hinde take home one of the raffle prizes, as did Dawn, our guest Foliage Judge. We hope you enjoy your prizes. Ron Russell and our President were also raffle winners.
