IT'S NEARLY SHOWTIME AGAIN......

With only weeks to our Easter Show, it's time to go through your collection to remove dead leaves/ flowers and weeds and generally tidy up any prospective Show plants, either for sale or benching. Make sure that pots are clean and will not fall over when benched. Plants for benching or sale should be well established in their pots and free of pests and diseases. Buds should be staked to ensure that blooms are displayed to their best advantage. Presentation is everything. This applies not only to flowering plants but also to the myriad of non-flowering plants in the Plant Sales area. It's no good leaving these chores until the last minute as time is racing by. Please use the cream plant tags, available from Teresa for any plants being benched in the Open section and Foliage. New Growers can still use their blue plant tags as the New Grower Classes are restricted to Bribie Island Orchid Society New Growers only. Sales tags will be also be available from Teresa.

If you are selling plants, be realistic with your pricing and please make sure that your price tags are legible—whole dollars only please. All sales need to be keyed in to the computer so it really does help if figures are clearly written otherwise you may end up a little light in your expected return.

Donations of cakes, biscuits, slices etc are greatly appreciated for morning/afternoon teas.

The success of our Show really depends on the efforts of Society members so please give some thought as to what /where you might be able to contribute, however small. Many hands make light work and none of us are getting any younger!

Set up for the show will be at the Orchid House on Wednesday 27th March at 1pm.

Set up of the Indoor bowls club will start at 11am on Thursday 28th March.

Those helpers who wish to bench orchids or foliage are welcome to bring them inside out of their cars into The Orchid House.

Benching will take place from 2pm—5pm before the Judges dinner.





Our first New Growers Meeting for 2024 on Saturday 10th February 2024 will start at 12 noon with a welcome BBQ lunch followed by our meeting at 1.30pm.

The topic will be 'How to care for your orchids in wet/humid weather'.

Don't forget your plants for judging need to be benched by 1.15pm, and you are welcome to bring along any problem plants you may have.

A little bit of trivia for those interested in statistics...... During 2023, a total of 498 orchids and 349 foliage plants were benched over 11 Cultural Meetings, and 49 orchids were benched over 8 New Grower Meetings. Well done exhibitors! Let's see if we can exceed those numbers in 2024.

A ROADMAP FOR NEW GROWERS



You've joined the Bribie Island Orchid Society and have an orchid in flower. What should you do?

Firstly, remember that you must have owned your plants for at least 6 months before you are able to bench them for judging. If you have recently acquired a plant and it is flowering, you may bench it with a sign 'Not to be judged - Display only'. Please don't judge your own plant/s and bring them along to the New Growers Meeting held on the second Saturday of the month, and the Cultural Meeting on the fourth Tuesday of the month.

You will then need to complete a blue slip with the name of your plant on the front (if you don't know the name, just put 'Unknown') and add your name and Pot/Member number on the back. The blue slip should be displayed on a wire in your pot with the name of the plant facing forward.

At Cultural Meetings only -Enter The Orchid House and sign the attendance book at the front counter. When signed in, proceed with your plant to the rear of the hall on the left hand side and from the pegboard select the tag with your 'Pot/Member Number' and drop it in the tin on the table where the President, Secretary and Treasurer sit for the meeting. During the meeting one of those tags will be drawn with the owner of that tag receiving a \$5 voucher to spend with Paul Firth at our Cultural Supplies corner. Your name and Pot/Member No. can be found on the board beside the tag board.

Then proceed to the tables on the right hand side of the hall where you will find signs designating the various genera eg Novice Cattleya, Novice Dendrobium, etc and deposit your plant. If you don't know which section fits, any of our friendly members are only too happy to help.

B I O S run 2 competitions each year for New Growers, apart from our two shows (Easter and October). The first competition is run at the New Growers Meetings where points are allocated – 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd and 1 for 3rd. The Judge's Choice at this meeting not only wins points but also 'The Finger' (a small wooden trophy shaped like Bribie Island), which the grower gets to hold for the next month, and a plant. These points are accumulated from 1st June to 30th May each year with the winner/s announced at our AGM/Cultural Meeting at the end of June.

The other competition is run for New Growers who bench their plants at the monthly Cultural Meetings. In addition to points and 'The Finger', the Judges Choice plant is also photographed and these photos are judged at the end of the year and the winning grower/s presented with the Merv Anderson Award for the best New Grower plant.

There will be a special award for the most successful New Grower (Bribie Island Orchid Society Members only) at our Easter Show in March 2024.

This Award will be sponsored by Rob & Linda Trost from RoLin Orchids and will be a \$100 voucher to purchase plants from their nursery at Wamuran. According to Rob, this voucher should buy you 6-8 plants to grow your collection.

NB Foliage plants are judged at monthly Cultural Meetings only, and there is no separate section for New Growers. Foliage plants are benched on the tables to the right as you enter The Orchid House, with categories of Bromeliads, Tillandsias, Anthuriums, Ferns, Other Foliage and Foliage with Flowers. New Growers are welcome to bring foliage plants along to the New Grower Meetings for display only.

During the Cultural meeting, the President will call for members to select their favourite orchid and foliage plant, and record those plant numbers of slips of paper which are then deposited into the appropriate container at the management table. The votes are then counted and \$5 Cultural Corner vouchers are presented to the growers of **the 'People's Choice' Orchid and Foliage plant.** New Growers plants are known to have been winners of these categories in the past.

So New Growers, don't be shy! Please bring your flowering plants along to be benched. We'd all love to see what you are growing.

UPCOMING SHOWS

JANUARY 2024 CULTURAL MEETING

We had a great roll up of 33 members and 2 visitors for our first Cultural Meeting of 2024 so thanks to the members who attended. There were concerns numbers might be down due to the holiday season and the relentless hot humid weather.

Our Guest Speaker for the day was Jen Ison from Red Fox Orchids who gave a very interesting talk on growing Oncidiums. Red Fox source a lot of their young stock from the Netherlands and Thailand. Jen brought along a series of Oncid plants in various stages of growth and discussed their process of progressively moving up pot sizes as plants grow from the small coir/peat 'plugs' (which stay attached to the plant throughout it's growth) then 70mm tubes through to 150mm pots which have a bit of depth using a cocochip/perlite mix with gypsum (calcium) added. They also use controlled watering every 2-3 days and ideally water for 10 minutes, wait for about an hour and water again. Don't forget the snail bait! Repotting occurs every 12—18 months as coconut breaks down faster than bark. Oncids like bright light and good air movement, keep an eye out for mealy bugs and scale and brown leaf tips = too much fertilizer so make sure you flush your pots regularly, Thank you Jen.

Numbers on the benches were a bit light on—38 orchids and 24 foliage plants, but the numbers were not surprising given the crazy weather we've endured over the last few weeks. Those with open shadehouses certainly haven't had to worry about watering for a while! Our Orchid judges for the day were Martin and Zelda, who had to step aside for the other to judge any plants they had in various classes in Tony's absence. Trish was also absent so our President Di and Secretary Teresa judged the Foliage section. Thank you judges. Teresa and Joe took out the Judges Choice - Open and People's Choice—Orchids with their stunning V. Fantastic Fanfare and Zelda took out the Judges Choice and People's Choice—Foliage with her unusual *Bowiea volubilis* (Climbing Onion Plant) which she says is just loving the current weather conditions. This plant, which is about 40 years old, proved a bit tricky to photograph and though they're very hard to see, it's covered with tiny yellow flowers and buds.

Our social butterfly Liz gave an update on planned activities—the bus trip to the Queensland International Orchid Fair on Friday 16th February is now fully booked however Liz has a Wait List if you would still like to put your name down as there are usually a couple of last minute casualties. After our visit to the Orchid Fair, the group will head to the Elysium Restaurant & Bar at Victoria Point for Lunch, followed by a visit to Fame Orchids at Thornlands and the adjacent Timbara Nursery before heading back to the Island. Sounds like a great day out.

B I O S members have been invited to attend Bryan Hillier's Dracena Farm Nursery at Beachmere on Friday 1st March from 9am—2pm. This is a Production Nursery and normally not open to the public. Members who attended in the past were very impressed with the setup and the tours of some of the growing houses and were able to purchase some of the thousands of orchids, tillandsias, succculents and foliage plants that the nursery produces. Car pooling is suggested and members must register their intention to attend with Liz by Friday 23rd February for Hillier's insurance purposes.

After the Judges' commentary and raffle draw, the meeting finished with afternoon tea and a catchup before members headed home.

Cultural Notes - Mid-Summer

February and March are active growing months so make sure the growing conditions encourage this fully. Unfortunately pests and some diseases also enjoy hot, moist conditions. Maintain shading, watering and feeding to benefit from this active growing period, but make an extra effort to ensure good ventilation. Ventilation does not only mean air movement around the stems and leaves. Your potting medium should be open enough that the roots can dry out between waterings. As well as removing any old or dead leaves and other material from the plants, remove any weeds or 'volunteer' ferns and foliage plants, etc. Most of our commonly grown orchids will burn during our hot dry spells in summer, so usually we should provide extra shade and extra water, even just misting on days between waterings. However it has been great weather for aphids, mealy bugs and fungus. Check whether your plants need some Conguard (for aphids), metho, for mealy bugs and Mancozeb or Fongarid (for fungus).

Cattleyas (and their hybrids with Brassavolas, Laelias and Sophronitis) Many of these will be preparing for Autumn flowering. As these began as true epiphytes they need occasional thorough soakings followed by drier spells but still with high humidity. Give a thorough soaking twice a week but be prepared for more if the humidity drops. Make sure that water does not sit for long in developing flower spikes. Continue with weak, balanced fertiliser.

Dendrobiums (Hard cane types, Australian natives & their hybrids, including Intermediate types.) These are used to a hot, wet, monsoon type summer with a winter drought. They come from open woodlands so need high light levels. Water them three times a week but allow them to dry out between waterings. Continue with weak balanced fertiliser You should be seeing new flower spikes ready for autumn flowers. Dendrobiums are particularly sensitive to light direction so try to stake spikes early and keep them oriented to the north.

Dendrobiums (Soft cane types & their hybrids) These are used to a hot, wet, monsoon type summer so it is impossible to overwater or overfeed them at this stage. The deciduous forests they come from do not have high light levels in summer. However by Autumn they will require completely different treatment.

Oncidiums (As well as Miltonias, Brassias & their hybrids) Generally these take less light than Cattleyas but the situation is complicated. Most of the hybrids will take the same light as Cattleyas but any hybrid with Odontoglossum will need cool conditions. In Summer the main requirement is not to let their leaves burn, and to keep them moist. By now you should have finished any repotting and many of the Brassia hybrids will be sending out new flower spikes.

Vandas (and their related species and hybrids) Most of these grow with bare, exposed roots and so need to have moist air around them. They should be watered every second day, and humidity levels can be kept up by extra, light mistings or by damping down the floor below them.

Phalaenopsis These orchids are like the Vandas in their growth habit, their big fleshy, exposed roots and their lack of pseudobulbs. They must not be left to dry out, nor should they be left with water in the crown of the plant. Treat them as indoor plants but make sure they have good light.

Paphiopedilum These plants also lack pseudobulbs and so need regular watering, probably every third day. Again, water sitting in the crown of the plant can rot newly emerging flower bulbs.
